

2010 WARREN COUNTY FAIR 4-H LIVESTOCK BARN RULES

- **Remember that your actions this week (youth & adults) reflect on the entire 4-H Program.**
- Always make safety your #1 priority.
- Closed-toed shoes must be worn in the barn **at all times by 4-H Youth & Adults**
- Individual stalls/pens must be kept clean.
- The barn must be clean and orderly when the gates open daily at 4:00pm.
- All equipment, chairs, feed, tack, etc. must be removed from the center aisles by 4:00pm.
- All trash must be placed in the proper receptacles.
- All 4-H members should pick up any trash they see lying around the barn area.
- The wash rack is open to animals that are to be shown that day before all other species.
- All animals are to be kept in the barn area. They are not to be walked in front of the stage or in the carnival area.
- All cattle must wear a secondary neck rope.
- No Smoking in or around the barn.
- No foul language.
- No tobacco used by persons under 18.
- No alcoholic beverages are allowed on the premises during 4-H events. Anyone found with alcohol will be asked to leave the Fairgrounds.
- **No Dogs Allowed** in the barn or on the Fairgrounds during the week of the Fair (WCFA Rule).
- You may hang banners, etc. in the barn, but on clean-up day you must remove all staples, nails, etc. from the wood.
- All vehicles must be moved to the 4-H Parking Area by 4:00pm.
- Vehicles are only allowed in front of the barn for loading and unloading.
- Read and abide by all of the rules printed in the 2009-2010 4-H Livestock Program Guide.
- Bathrooms: Use Porta Johns as first choice. **Office Bathrooms use for cleanup only.** Must leave bathroom clean. Lock the door as you leave, do not let anyone else in.
- Before you go up “on the hill” to the Carnival, make sure your pens are clean and your animals have food and water.
- If you’ll be coming and going during the week, it is your responsibility to help clean up the barn area for the public before you leave the Fairgrounds.
