

2010 WARREN COUNTY FAIR 4-H LIVESTOCK SALE RULES

A 4-Her's livestock projects are limited by the following, so, please pay close attention to these stipulations.

Only six (6) projects can be sold by any one (1) livestock exhibitor (Male breeding animals will NOT be sold). These six animals must be selected from the animals that are shown in competition. Only two (2) project market & breeding animals from each of the following categories may be shown:

Market Steer & Breeding	<i>to be sold by the pound</i>
Market Lamb & Breeding	<i>to be sold by the pound</i>
Market Hog & Breeding	<i>to be sold by the pound</i>
Market Goat & Breeding	<i>to be sold by the head</i>

You may select any combination of six (6) animals for sale. (Example: 2 Market Steers, 2 Market Lambs, 1 Market Hog and 1 Market Goat.) Grand or Reserve Grand Rabbit or Poultry exhibits do not count toward the six (6).

- LS1. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion market animals must be sold. Any breeding animal will be allowed to be *sold by the head* if the exhibitor wishes to sell them. These projects are sold in addition to the saleable market projects in that species (*time permitting*).
- LS2. **All exhibitors must notify the Extension Staff no later than 3 PM on Thursday of Fair week, which animals they wish to sell during the sale. If not notified by 3 PM, animals CAN NOT BE SOLD unless required by other rules.**
- LS3. Beginning September 30, 2008, **federal law requires that Warren County 4-H, as the buyer/agent, have all sellers sign an affidavit compliant with COOL. The exhibitor must sign the COOL affidavit, not the parent, since the animal will be sold in the exhibitor's name.** Warren County 4-H will keep the affidavits on file after the sale in the event that COOL verification is requested. - LS4. A 5% sales commission per sale animal sold at the Warren County 4-H Livestock Show and Sale (market and breeding) will be deducted from exhibitor project proceeds. Sale projects are determined by the way they are listed on the program. Fees will be used to cover cost of program awards, judges, facilities, advertisement and publicity of buyer recognition following the fair.
- LS5. Resale of Animals. Individuals or businesses who purchase livestock through the Warren County 4-H Livestock Sale may choose to donate their purchase for re-sale. The buyer may donate the animal to the group, organization or individual of their choice. At the time of the announcement of the donation, the animal becomes the property of the group or individual receiving the donation.
- Only livestock that has been donated in the name of either the local 4-H Program, 4-H Fair Fund or The 4-H Barn Fund are eligible to be re-sold directly through, and at the end of the scheduled 4-H Livestock Sale (*time permitting*).
 - All other donations for re-sale will be taken to a local livestock auction and sold in the name of the individual or group receiving the donation. All monies received, minus normal sale commissions, will be mailed directly to the group or individual.

- Any buyer who wishes to donate any livestock that has been purchased through the Warren County 4-H Livestock Sale must notify the Sale Clerk by the end of the regularly scheduled sale.

- LS7. All buyers must register and obtain a buyer's number. **Buyers shall make payment to the Finance Committee the day of sale or with prior permission, within seven (7) days of the sale.** The Finance Committee will pay the Exhibitor in one check after all monies for all animals sold by that Exhibitor have been received and given a 7-day grace period for checks to clear.
- LS8. All livestock sold during the auction must be removed from the barn/grounds by 8am on Sunday, August 8, 2010.
